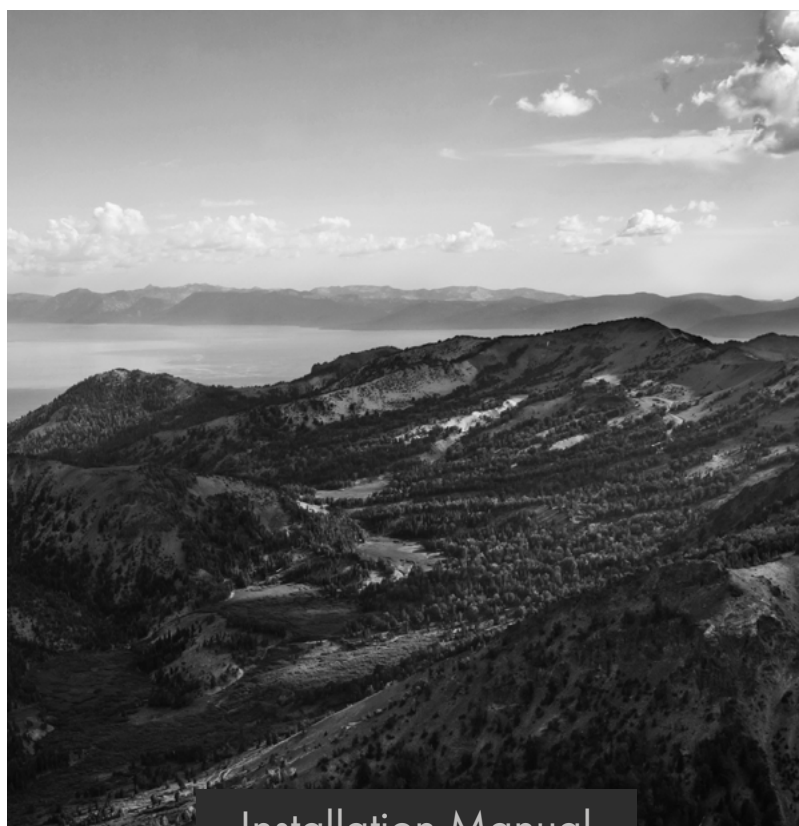

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



Before operation, please read and follow these important instructions for the safety of your home and the people living in it.

- When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should be followed, including the following:
- Install or locate this appliance only in accordance with the provided installation instructions.
- This appliance is intended to be used in households and similar applications such as: staff kitchen areas in shops, offices, and other working environments; by clients in hotels, motels, and other residential type environments; farm houses; and bed and breakfast type environments.
- Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open. This can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy.
- Do not break or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaning residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door closes properly and that there is no damage to the:
 - Door (bent or broken)
 - Hinges and latches (broken or loosened)
 - Door seals and sealing surfaces (dirty or eroding)
- The oven should not be adjusted or repaired by anyone except properly qualified service personnel.
- If the oven is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surface could be degraded and affect the lifespan of the oven and lead to a dangerous situation.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this appliance
- This type of oven is designed to heat, cook, or defrost food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering.
- Heavily soiled seal: If the seal is very dirty or eroded, the appliance door will no longer close properly during operation. The fronts of adjacent units could also be damaged. Always keep the seal clean.
- This appliance can be used by children if they have been given supervision or instruction on use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision. Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children without supervision.
- If the electrical cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or a similarly qualified professional in order to avoid a hazard.
- Do not immerse cord or plug in water.
- Keep cord away from heated surface.
- Do not let cord hang over edge of table or counter.
- Do not cover or block any openings on the appliance.
- Do not store this appliance outdoors. Do not use near water — for example, near a kitchen sink, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, or similar location.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- To reduce the risk of fire inside the oven:
 - Do not overcook food. Carefully oversee appliance when paper, plastic, or other combustible materials are placed inside the oven to facilitate cooking.
 - Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bags before placing bags in oven.
- If material inside the oven ignites, keep oven door closed, turn oven off, and disconnect power cord or shut off power at the circuit breaker.
 - Do not use the microwave for storage purposes.
 - Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils, or food inside when not in use.
- If smoke is emitted, switch off and unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
- Care should be taken not to displace the turntable when removing containers from the appliance.
- Some products, such as whole eggs and sealed containers — for example, closed glass jars — can explode and should not be heated in this oven.



Liquids and other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Liquids such as water, coffee, or tea may be heated beyond the boiling point without appearing to be boiling. Visible bubbling or boiling when the container is removed from the microwave oven is not always present. **THIS COULD RESULT IN VERY HOT LIQUID SUDDENLY BOILING OVER WHEN THE CONTAINER IS DISTURBED OR A UTENSIL IS INSERTED INTO THE LIQUID.** To reduce the risk of injury to persons:
 - Do not overheat the liquid.
 - Stir the liquid both before and halfway through heating it.
 - Do not use straight-sided containers with narrow necks.
 - After heating, allow the container to stand in the microwave oven for a short time before removing the container.
 - Use extreme care when inserting a spoon or other utensil into the container.
- Do not store anything directly on top of the appliance surface when the appliance is in operation.
- Oversized food or oversized metal utensils should not be inserted in the oven as they may create a fire or risk of electric shock.
- The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.
- Do not clean with metal scouring pads. Pieces can burn off the pad and touch electrical parts, increasing the risk of electric shock.
- Do not store any materials, other than manufacturer's recommended accessories, in this oven when not in use.
- Do not cover racks or any part of the oven with metal foil.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.
- Only use utensils suitable for use in microwave ovens.
- The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars must be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption in order to avoid burns.
- The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed since they may explode even after microwave heating has ended.
- The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloths, and similar items may lead to risk of injury, ignition, or fire.



The appliance and accessible parts become hot during use. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking.

- The appliance is intended to be used built-in.
- The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating.
- Using metal, aluminum, or other non-microwave-safe objects in the microwave function can cause sparks. Sparks can irreparably damage the glass on the inside of the door.
- Never pour water inside the oven. This will cause steam. The temperature change can cause damage.
- Do not store moist food in the oven for long periods.
- Do not use the appliance to store food. This can lead to corrosion.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Do not trap anything in the appliance door. Even if the door is only slightly ajar, the fronts of adjacent units may be damaged over time.
- Do not operate the microwave without food inside. Doing so may lead to power overloading. Never switch on the appliance unless there is food in the cooking compartment.
- When using the convection bake/roast or convection + micro features, the plastic coupler and turntable ring inside the unit do NOT need to be removed; neither will be impacted by these forms of cooking.
- Do not operate any heating or cooking appliance beneath, over, or near the appliance. It is okay to use the microwave above another heating appliance.
- This appliance is suitable for use above both gas and electric cooking equipment.
- Do not mount over any sinks.
- Do not store anything directly on top of the appliance surface when the appliance is in operation.
- Clean ventilation hoods frequently. Grease should not be allowed to accumulate on the hood or filters.
- Use care when cleaning the vent-hood filter. Corrosive cleaning agents may damage the filter.

BEFORE INSTALLATION

ELECTRIC SHOCK HAZARD



- Before you plug in an electrical cord or turn on power supply, make sure all controls are in the OFF position. Before installing, turn power OFF at the service panel.
- Connect the appliance only to properly grounded outlet. Improper grounding may result in electrical shock. Consult a qualified electrician if the grounding instructions are not completely understood, or if doubt exists as to whether the appliance is properly grounded.
- Do not cut or remove the ground prong. It must be plugged into a matching grounding type receptacle to avoid electrical shock.
- Installation, electrical connections, and grounding must comply with all applicable codes. In the event of a short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current.



Improper use of the grounding can result in a risk of electric shock.

- If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire cord that has a 3-prong grounded plug and a 3-slot receptacle. The marked rating of the extension cord shall be equal to or greater than the electrical rating of the appliance.
- Only a qualified electrician who takes the appropriate regulations into account may install the socket or replace the connecting cable.
- Touching some of the internal components of this appliance can cause serious personal injury or death. Do not disassemble this product. Improper use of the grounding can result in electrical shock. Do not plug into an outlet until appliance is properly installed and grounded.
- A short power-supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.



We do not recommend using an extension cord and if used on this appliance, it will void warranty. If you use an extension cord, make sure the wire gauge and length are correct for use with a microwave. The use of an extension cord can cause voltage drop, fire hazard, and can cause permanent damage to the microwave if used.

BEFORE INSTALLATION

ELECTRICAL REQUIREMENTS

- A 3-prong grounded outlet
- 120VAC, 60Hz, NEMA 5-15 plug
- 15-amp electrical supply with a fuse or a circuit breaker

OTHER INSTALLATION NOTES

- For personal safety, remove house fuse or open circuit breaker before beginning installation to avoid severe or fatal shock injury. *Figure 1*
- The mounting surface must be capable of supporting the cabinet load, in addition to the added weight of this product (63-85 pounds, 28.5-38.5 kg), plus additional oven loads of up to 50 pounds (22.7 kg) for a total weight of 113-135 pounds (51.3-61.2 kg).
- Do not install this product in cabinet arrangements such as an island or a peninsula. It must be mounted to BOTH a top cabinet AND a wall.
- The power cord of this appliance is equipped with a 3-prong grounding plug that mates with a standard 3-prong wall receptacle to minimize the possibility of electric shock hazard from this appliance. *Figure 2*
- If a 2-prong wall receptacle is encountered, it must be replaced with a properly grounded 3-prong receptacle by a qualified electrician.



Do not under any circumstances cut, deform, or remove any of the prongs from the power cord.

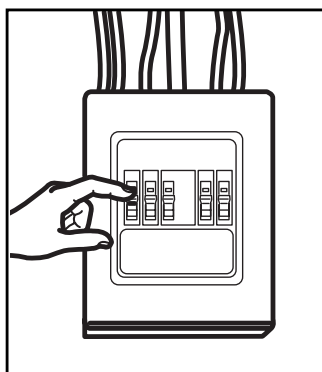

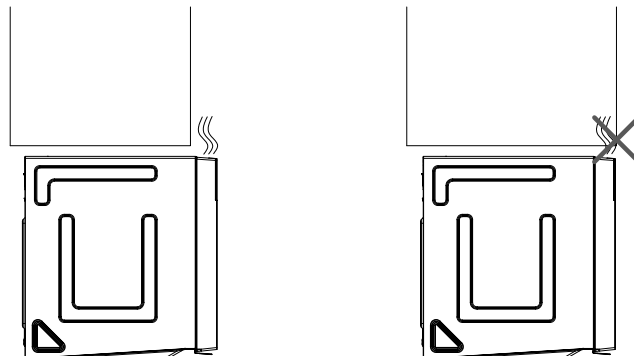


INSTALLATION

MOUNTING SPACE



- The space between cabinets must be 30" wide and free of obstructions.
- If you are going to vent your microwave oven outside your home, see the External Exhaust section starting on page 17 for exhaust duct preparation.
- When installing the microwave oven beneath smooth, flat cabinets, be careful to follow the instructions on the top cabinet template for power cord clearance.
- If the cabinet depth including the cabinet doors is more than 13", the unit must be placed out from the wall using adequate materials supporting 150 pounds to allow for proper top ventilation air exhaust/intake as outlined below.

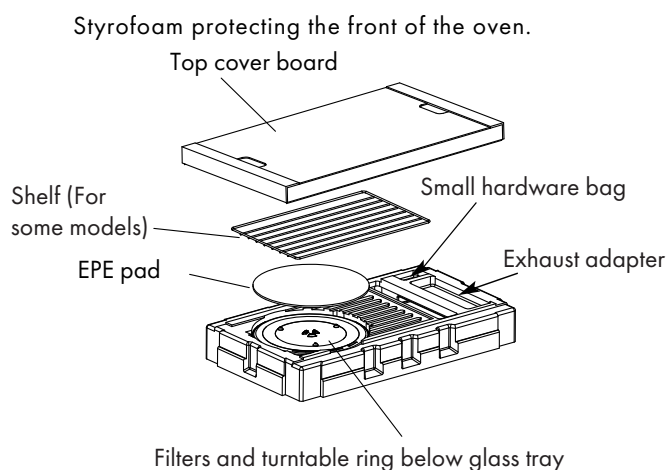

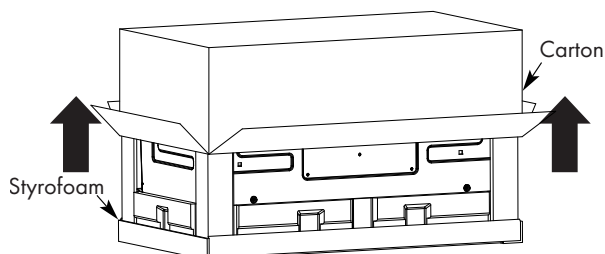
PLACEMENT OF THE MOUNTING PLATE

A. Removing the Microwave Oven from the Box/Removing the Mounting Plate

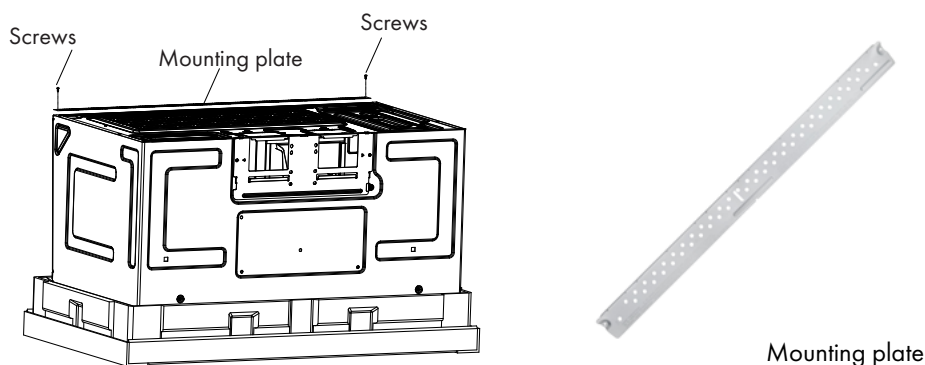
1. When unpacking the appliance, remove the top cover board, manuals, exhaust adapter, turntable ring, shelf, filters, glass tray, and the small hardware bag.



2. Fold back all four box flaps fully against the box sides. Then carefully rotate the oven and box over onto the top side. The oven should be resting on the Styrofoam.



3. Pull up box up and off the oven.
4. Cut the middle of the outer protective plastic bag to remove the mounting plate.

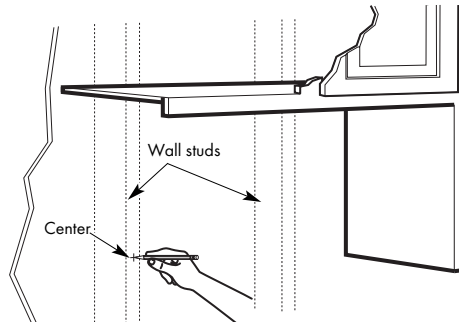


5. Remove the screws from each end of the mounting plate. This plate will be used as the rear wall template. Reinstall the screws into the holes where they were removed.

PLACEMENT OF THE MOUNTING PLATE

B. Finding the Wall Studs



1. Use a stud finder to locate wooden studs in the rear wall of the cabinet cutout where you plan to install the unit. If you don't have a stud finder, use a hammer to tap lightly across the mounting surface horizontally until you hear a solid sound. This will indicate a stud location.
2. After locating the stud(s), find the center by probing the wall with a small nail to find the edges of the stud. Use a pencil to mark the halfway point between the edges. The center of any adjacent studs should be 16" or 24" from this mark, depending on your home's design.
3. Draw a line down the center of the studs.



The microwave must be connected to at least one wall stud, as the mounting surface must be capable of supporting the cabinet load, in addition to the added weight of this product (63-85 pounds, 28.5-38.5 kg), plus additional oven loads of up to 50 pounds (22.7 kg) for a total weight of 113-135 pounds (51.3-61.2 kg). Mounting the unit to drywall will not meet this requirement, and you run the risk of serious injury or death if the appliance falls from its supports.

PLACEMENT OF THE MOUNTING PLATE

C. Determining Wall Plate Location Under your Cabinet

Plate position: Beneath Flat Bottom Cabinet

Draw a vertical line on the wall at the center of the 30" wide space. Tape the Rear Wall Template onto the wall matching the centerline and touching the bottom of the cabinet.

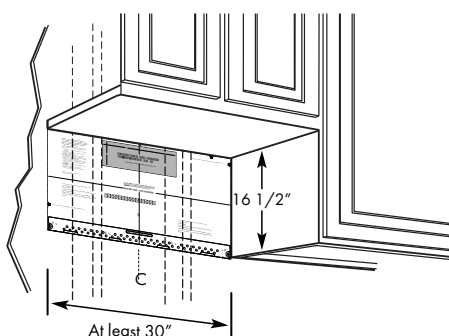


Plate position: Beneath Framed Recessed Cabinet Bottom

Draw a vertical line on the wall at the center of the 30" space. Tape the Rear Wall Template onto the wall matching the centerline and touching the bottom cabinet frame.

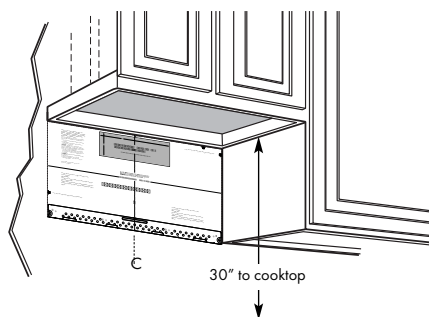
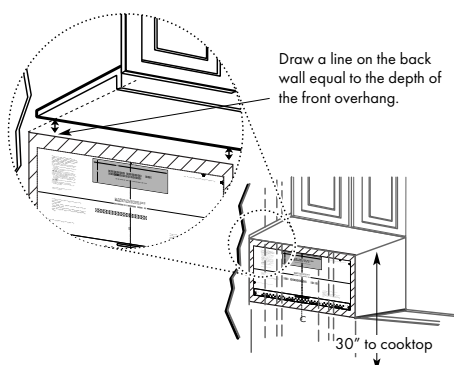


Plate position: Beneath Recessed Bottom Cabinet with Front Overhang

Draw a line on the back wall equal to the depth of the front overhang.



INSTALLATION

PLACEMENT OF THE MOUNTING PLATE

NOTE: Depending on the design of your kitchen, cabinets may have decorative trim that interferes with the microwave installation. Remove the decorative trim to install the microwave properly and make it level.



CAUTION

THE MICROWAVE MUST BE LEVEL.

Use a level to make sure the cabinet bottom is level. If the cabinets have a front overhang only, with no back or side frame, install the mounting plate down the same distance as the front overhang depth. This will keep the microwave level.

1. Measure the inside depth of the front overhang.
2. Draw a horizontal line on the back wall, an equal distance below the cabinet bottom as the inside depth of the front overhang.
3. For this type of installation with front overhang only, align the mounting tabs with this horizontal line, not touching the cabinet bottom as described on the next page.

PLACEMENT OF THE MOUNTING PLATE

D. Aligning the Wall Plate



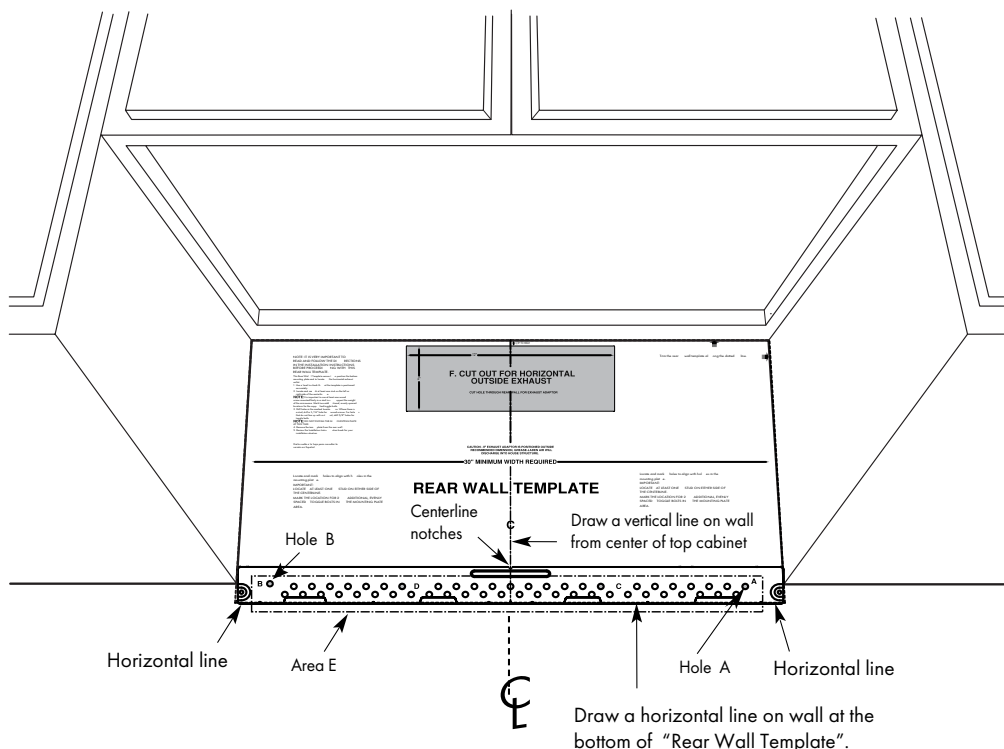
Wear gloves to avoid cutting fingers on sharp edges.

1. Draw a vertical line on the wall at the center of the 30" wide space.
2. Draw a horizontal line on the wall at the bottom of the "Rear Wall Template."
3. Find a wall stud in area "E" of the mounting plate. Mark the location the stud lines up with the area "E" of the mounting plate.
4. For attaching the mounting plate into stud, drill a $3/16$ " hole into wood stud. Drill a $5/8$ " hole for toggle bolt in 1 other location (Hole A or Hole B).



Do not mount the plate at this time.

NOTE: Holes A and B are inside area E. If neither of Holes A and B are not in a stud, find a stud somewhere in area E and draw a circle to line up with the stud. It is important to have at least one wood screw mounted firmly in a stud to support the weight of the microwave. Set the mounting plate aside.

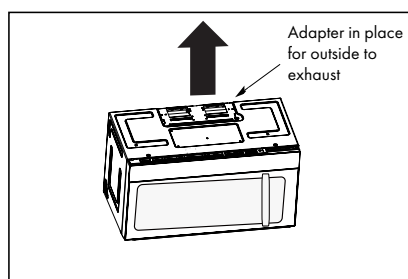
INSTALLATION TYPES (Choose A, B, or C)

The microwave oven is designed for adaption to the following types of ventilation:

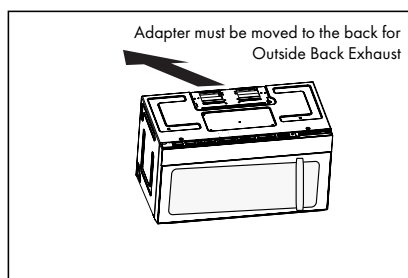
- A. Outside Top Exhaust (Vertical Duct)
- B. Outside Back Exhaust (Horizontal Duct)
- C. Recirculating (Non-Vented Ductless)

NOTE: This microwave is shipped assembled for Recirculating. Select the type of ventilation required for your installation and proceed to that section.

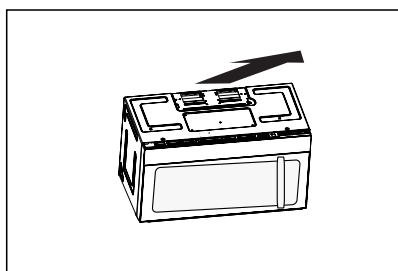
A: Outside Top Exhaust (Vertical Duct) - see page 21



B: Outside Back Exhaust (Horizontal Duct) - see page 28



C: Recirculating (Non-Vented Ductless) - see page 36: Models are shipped configured for recirculating exhaust. A disposable charcoal filter should be used to help remove smoke and odors when recirculating exhaust.



NOTE: Carefully read the following pages only if you plan to vent your exhaust to the outside. If you plan to recirculate the air back into the room, proceed to page 36.

INSTALLATION

INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXTERNAL EXHAUST DUCTING

NOTE: If you need to install ducts, note that the total length of 3 1/4" x 10" rectangular ducting — or 5" or 6" diameter round ducting — should not exceed 120 equivalent feet (shown how to calculate on the next page). Outside ventilation requires an EXTERNAL EXHAUST DUCT. Read the following carefully.

NOTE: It is important that venting be installed using the most direct route and with as few elbows as possible. This ensures clear venting of exhaust and helps prevent blockages. Also, make sure dampers swing freely and nothing is blocking the ducts.

EXHAUST CONNECTION

- The exhaust adapter for this appliance has been designated to mate with a standard 3 1/4" x 10" rectangular duct.
- If a round duct is required, a rectangular-to-round transition adapter must be used. These can be purchased at most local hardware stores. A 5" or 6" diameter round duct is acceptable to use.

MAXIMUM DUCT LENGTH

- For satisfactory air movement, the total length of 3 1/4" x 10" rectangular or 5"/6" diameter round ducting should not exceed 120 equivalent feet.
- Elbows, transitions, wall and roof caps, etc., present additional resistance to airflow and are equivalent to a section of straight duct that is longer than its actual physical size.
- When calculating total duct length, add the equivalent lengths of all transitions and adapters plus the length of all straight duct sections.
- The chart on the following page shows you how to calculate total equivalent ductwork length using the approximate length of typical ducting options.

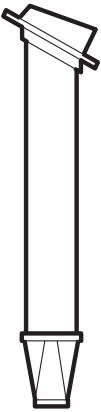

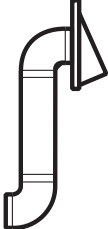

Equivalent lengths of duct pieces are based on actual ventilation tests and reflect requirements for good venting performance with any vent hood.

IMPORTANT: If a rectangular-to-round transition adapter is used, the bottom corners of the damper will have to be cut to fit using tin snips in order to allow free movement of the damper.

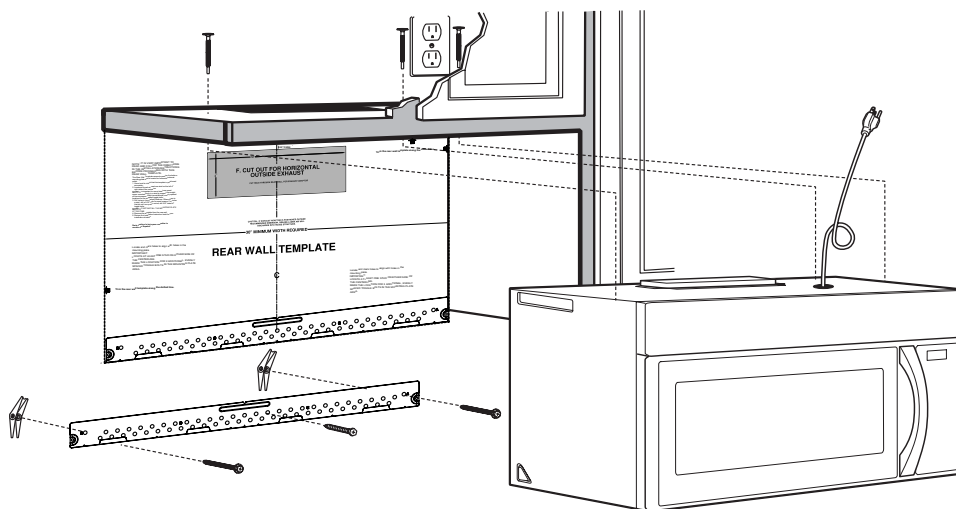

In both of these examples, the total equivalent ducting length is less than the maximum 120', meaning the microwave ventilations system is satisfactory.

NOTE: For back exhaust, care should be taken to align exhaust with space between studs, or wall should be prepared at the time it is constructed by leaving enough space between the wall studs to accommodate exhaust.

INSTALLATION (OUTSIDE TOP EXHAUST)

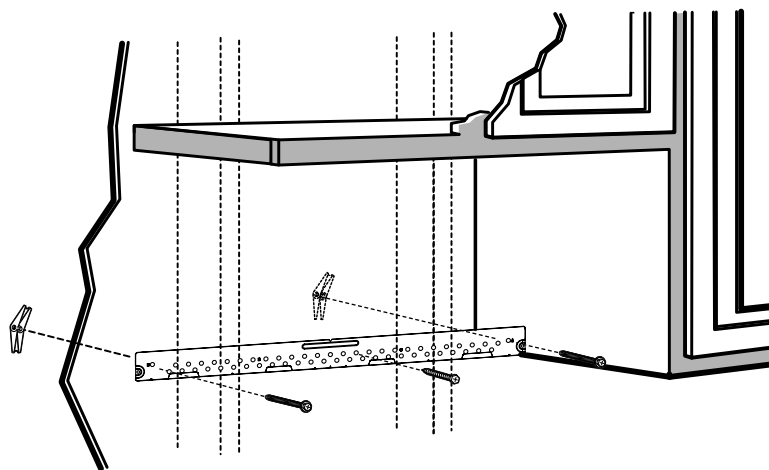
A. OUTSIDE TOP EXHAUST (VERTICAL DUCT)



NOTES:

- Make sure the screws for the blower motor and blower plate are securely tightened when they are reinstalled. This will help to prevent excessive vibration.
- Make sure the motor wiring has been properly routed and secured, and that the wires are not pinched.

A1. ATTACH THE MOUNTING PLATE TO THE WALL

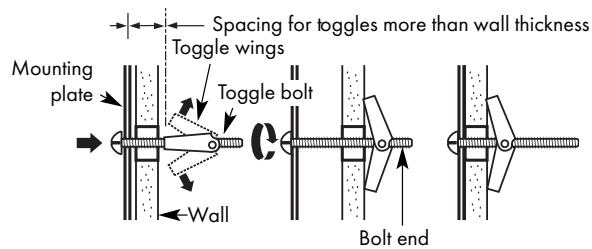


Attach the plate to the wall using toggle bolts. At least one wood screw must be used to attach the plate to a wall stud, as shown with the middle screw in the image above.

1. Remove the toggle wings from the bolts.
2. Insert the bolts into the mounting plate through the holes designated to go into drywall and reattach the toggle wings to 3/4" onto each bolt.

INSTALLATION (OUTSIDE TOP EXHAUST)

To use toggle bolts:



3. Place the mounting plate against the wall and insert the toggle wings into the holes in the wall to mount the plate.
 - **NOTE:** Before tightening toggle bolts and wood screws, make sure the bottom of the mounting plate touches the bottom of the cabinet when pushed flush against the wall and that the plate is properly centered under the cabinet.



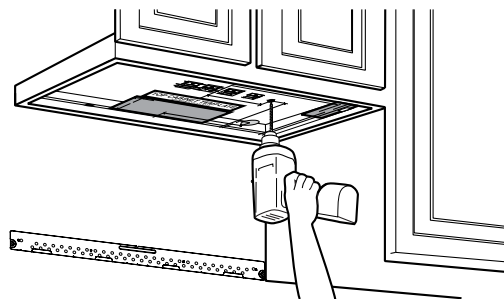
CAUTION

Be careful to avoid pinching your fingers between the back of the mounting plate and the wall.

4. Tighten all bolts. Pull the plate away from the wall to help tighten the bolts. If the toggle bolt spins, pull the mounting plate slightly outward while tightening the bolt until secure.

A2. USE TOP CABINET TEMPLATE FOR PREPARATION OF TOP CABINET

You need to drill holes for the top support screws, a hole large enough for the power cord to fit through, and a cutout large enough for the exhaust adapter.



- Read the instructions on the Top Cabinet Template.
- Tape the template underneath the top cabinet.
- Drill the holes, following the instructions on the Top Cabinet Template.
- The gray rectangle in the center of the template represents where to cut the opening for the top ducting/exhaust.



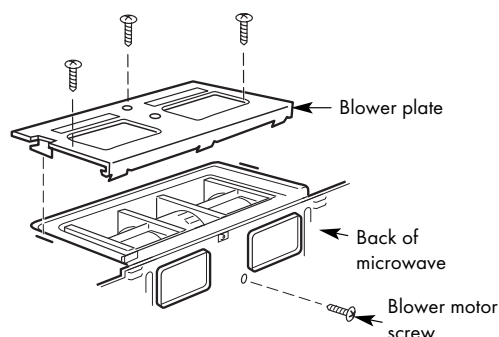
CAUTION

Wear safety goggles when drilling holes in the cabinet bottom.

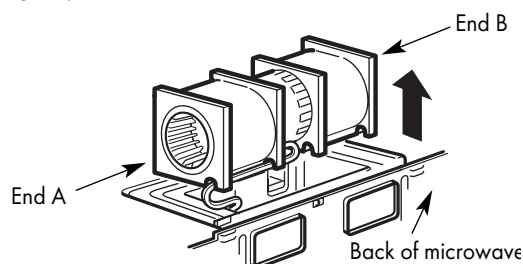
A3. ADAPTING MICROWAVE BLOWER FOR OUTSIDE TOP EXHAUST

1. Place the microwave in its upright position, with the top of the unit facing up.

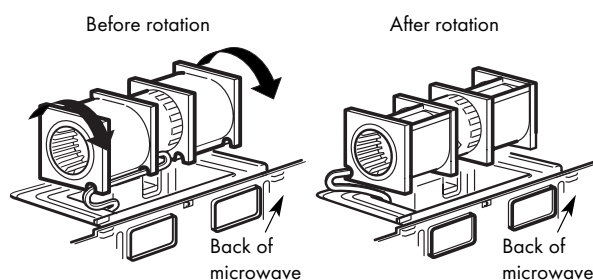


Remove the screws that holds the blower plate to the microwave. Remove and save the screws holding the blower motor to the microwave.

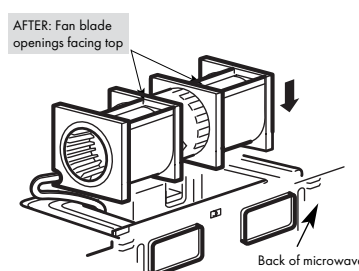
2. Carefully pull out the blower unit. The wires will extend far enough to allow you to adjust the blower unit.



3. Roll the blower unit 90° so that fan blade openings are facing out the top of the microwave.



4. Place the blower back into the opening.

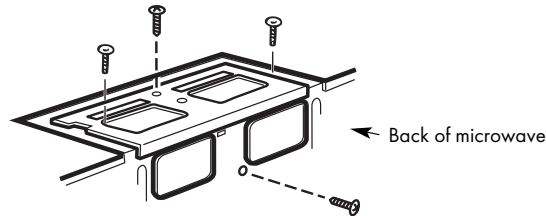


CAUTION

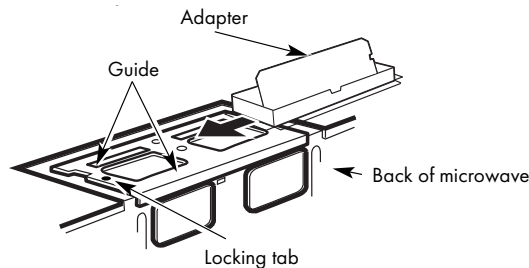
Do not pull or stretch the blower unit wiring. Make sure the wires are not pinched and that they are properly secured.

INSTALLATION (OUTSIDE TOP EXHAUST)

5. Secure the blower unit to microwave with the screw removed in Step 1. Make sure the screws are tight.
6. Replace the blower plate with the screws removed in Step 1. Make sure the screws are tight.



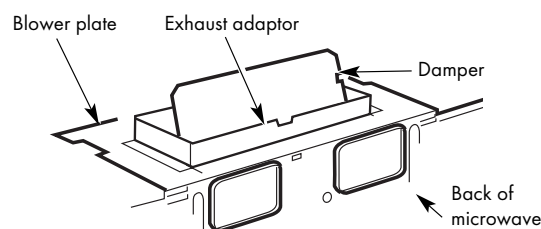
7. Attach the exhaust adapter to the top of the blower plate by sliding it into the guides of the blower plate.



Push in securely until it is in the locking tabs. Take care to assure that the damper hinge is installed so that the damper swings freely.

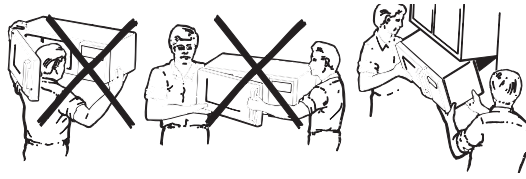
A4. CHECK FOR PROPER DAMPER OPERATION

- Make sure tape securing the damper is removed and the damper pivots easily before mounting microwave.
- You will need to make adjustments to assure proper alignment with your house exhaust duct after the microwave is installed.

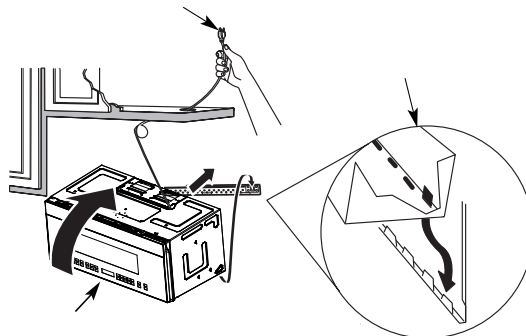
A5. MOUNT THE MICROWAVE OVEN



WARNING

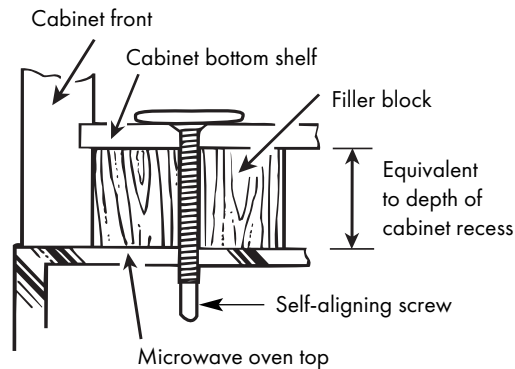
For easier installation and to avoid serious injury or death, it's recommended two or more people install this appliance.

- **IMPORTANT:** Do not grip or use the handle or heat shield during installation. Do not remove the cardboard spacers between the heat shield and door.
 - **NOTE:** If your cabinet is metal, use the nylon grommet around the power cord hole to prevent cutting of the cord.
 - **NOTE:** It's recommended you use filler blocks if the cabinet front hangs below the cabinet bottom shelf.
 - **IMPORTANT:** If filler blocks are not used, damage to the appliance casing may occur from over-tightening screws.
 - **NOTE:** When mounting the microwave oven, thread the power cord through hole in bottom of top cabinet. Keep it tight through Steps 1-3. Do not pinch cord or lift oven by pulling cord.
1. Lift the microwave, tilt it forward, and hook the slots at the back bottom edge onto four lower tabs of mounting plate.
 2. Rotate the front of oven up against the cabinet bottom.

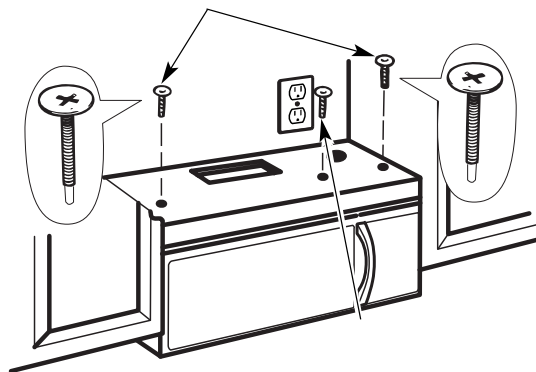

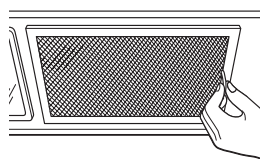
3. Insert one self-aligning screw through the top center cabinet hole. Temporarily secure the oven by turning the screw at least two full turns after the threads have engaged (do not tighten yet; it will be fully tightened later). Be sure to keep the power cord tight. Be careful not to pinch the cord, especially when mounting flush to bottom of cabinet.



4. Lift the microwave to the top of the cabinet and insert two additional self-aligning screws through the outer top cabinet holes. Give each screw two full turns, and then fully tighten the center screw inserted in step 3.



5. With the center screw secured, next, fully tighten the outer two screws to the top of the microwave oven. While tightening all screws, be sure to hold the microwave oven in place against the wall and the top cabinet.

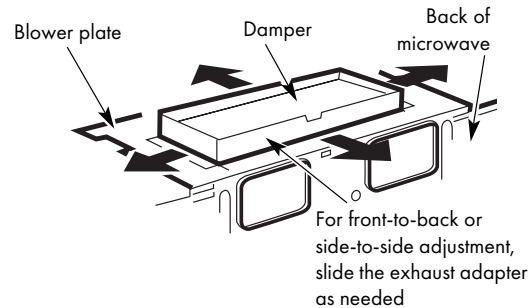

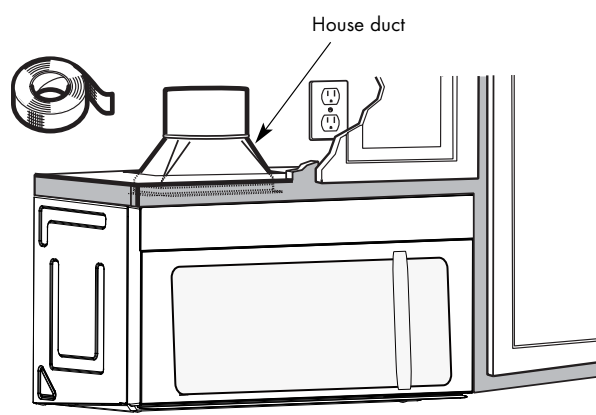
A6. ADJUST THE EXHAUST ADAPTER

Open the top cabinet and adjust the exhaust adapter to connect to the house duct.



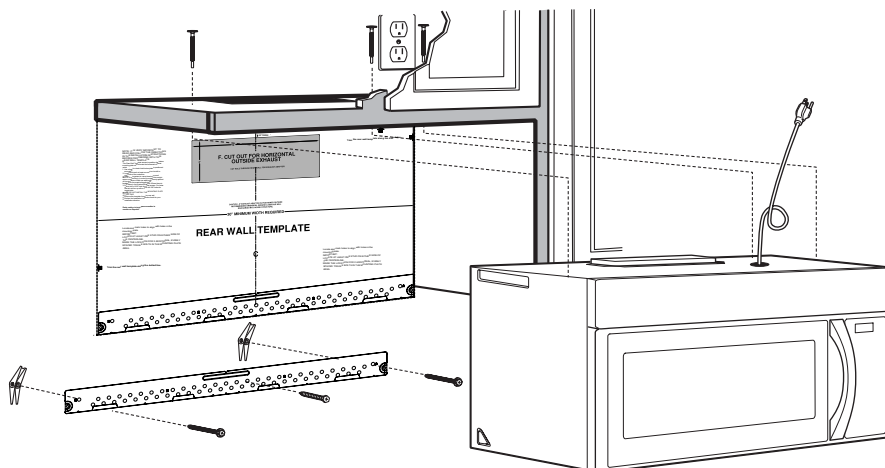
A7. CONNECTING DUCTWORK

1. Extend the house duct down to connect to the exhaust adapter.
2. Seal exhaust duct joints using furnace duct tape for high temperature applications.

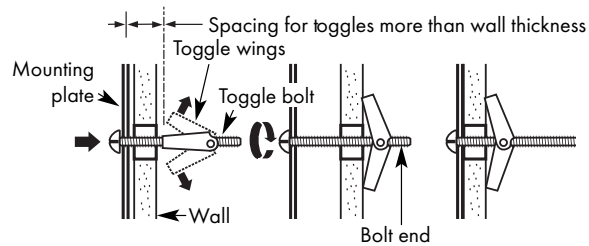
Attach the plate to the wall using toggle bolts. At least one wood screw must be used to attach the plate to a wall stud, as shown with the middle screw in the image below.



1. Remove the toggle wings from the bolts.
2. Insert the bolts into the mounting plate through the holes designated to go into drywall and reattach the toggle wings to 3/4" (19 mm) onto each bolt.

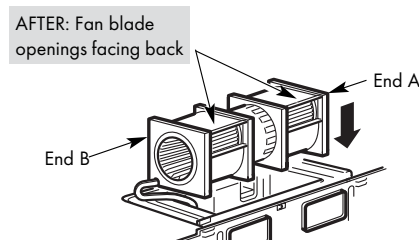


7. Remove the knockout plates in the back of the unit with tin snips. **NOTE:** This step is only needed for some models. Snip all 4 webs on each knockout panel and remove the metal knockouts for rear airflow. Please take care to eliminate any sharp edges created from removing the knockout plates.

1. Lift the microwave, tilt it forward, and hook the slots at the back bottom edge onto four lower tabs of mounting plate.
 2. Rotate the front of oven up against the cabinet bottom.

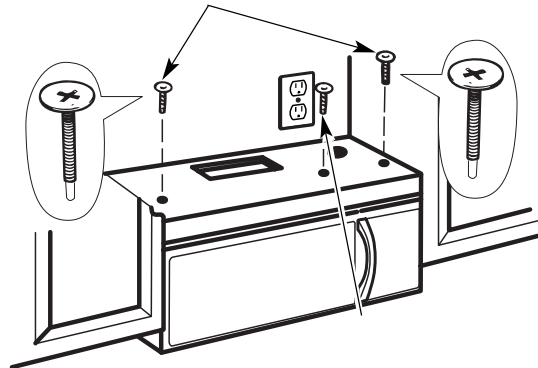

- Make sure the motor wiring has been properly routed and secured, and that the wires are not pinched.

C1. ATTACH THE MOUNTING PLATE TO THE WALL



- Attach the plate to the wall using toggle bolts. At least one wood screw must be used to attach the plate to a wall stud, as shown with the middle screw in the image above.
- **NOTE:** If the cabinet depth including the cabinet doors is more than 13", then the unit must be spaced out from the wall using adequate materials supporting 150 pounds to allow proper top vent air exhaust/intake as outlined below.

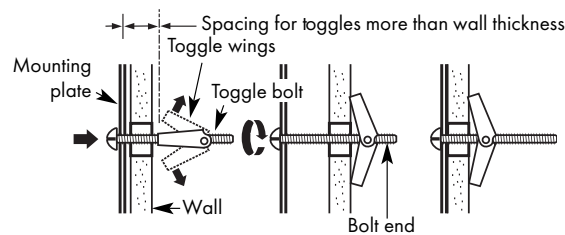

C5. REPLACING THE CHARCOAL FILTER

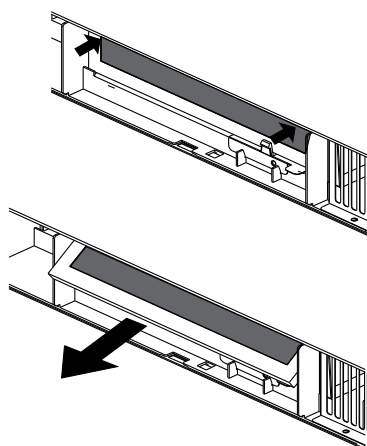
A charcoal filter is factory installed in most ZLINE MWO-OTR models; it's made of activated carbon that is specifically designed to remove contaminants and impurities from the air before recirculating back in your home.

Follow these steps to replace or install a charcoal filter:

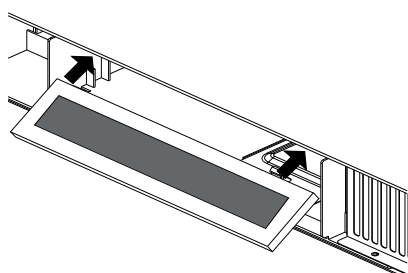
1. Unplug the microwave oven or disconnect power.
2. Open the microwave door and remove the two vent mounting screws located on top of the microwave using a #1 Phillips screwdriver.



3. Remove the charcoal filter by pushing the top of the filter inward, then pull it up, forward, and out from the unit.

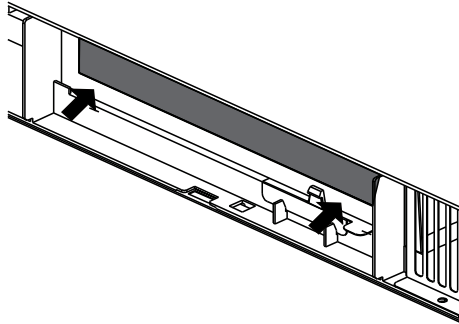


4. Slide the top of the new charcoal filter into the top of the filter cavity.

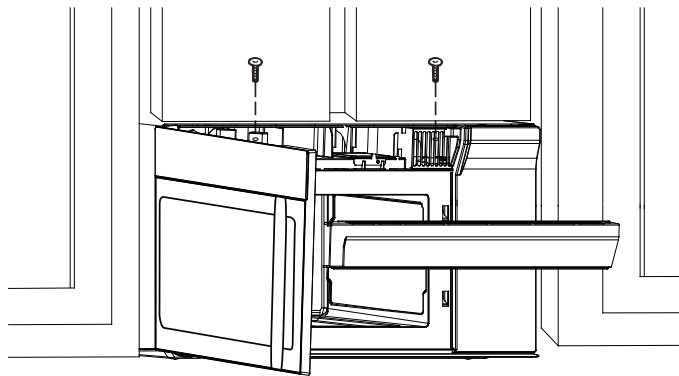

5. Following the reverse process of step 3, press the bottom of the charcoal filter to place it into the correct position.



6. Reinstall the vent by sliding the bottom of the vent into place. Push the vent top into position and slide right into place. Replace the two vent mounting screws located on top of the microwave using a #1 Phillips screwdriver.



7. Close the microwave door. Plug in microwave oven or reconnect power.

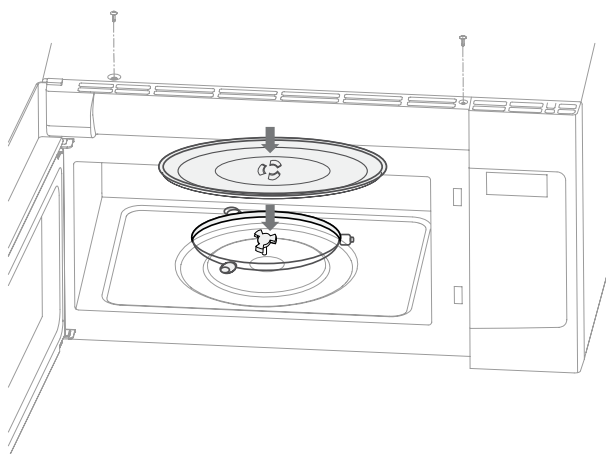
NOTE: ZLINE recommends replacing the charcoal filter every 6-9 months if your microwave is installed for recirculation. Depending on your cooking habits and household, charcoal filters may be replaced more frequently.

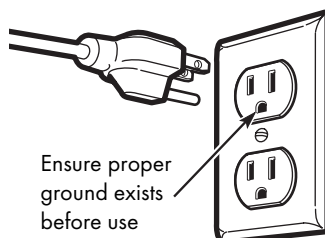

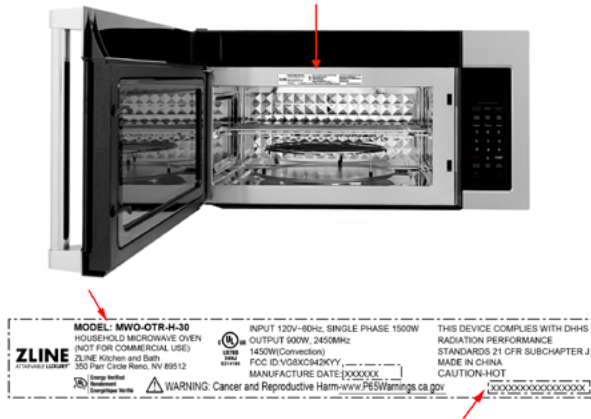
This warranty is non-transferable and will not be extended based on the date of installation. The warranty applies only to products installed in the continental United States and the District of Columbia.
